### Science Fair Deadlines

December 8th: Parent Night--Science Fair Viewing. Parents and students are invited to the CHMS Media Center from 6-7pm to view the finished Science Fair Projects.

## Supporting your Child in Science

**6th grade** students are learning about Earth Systems Patterns. Students are also working to complete their science fair projects. Parents, ask your children to identify the vocabulary terms that are being taught and how they relate to the real world! Also ensure that your students are working on OR have completed their science fair projects.

**7th grade** students are learning about Energy and Waves and working on completing their science fair projects; they are required to submit assignments each week. Parents, help your students generate testable questions for their science fair projects and help them to follow through with the steps of the scientific method for completing the project. Make sure that an adult is supervising the science experiment!

**8th grade** students are learning about Matter, Atoms and the Periodic Table. Parents, ask your children to identify the vocabulary terms are that are being taught and how they relate to the real world. Those who are completing the Science Fair project outside of school, parents ensure that your students are submitting the required assignments on the correct due dates.



## Attendance Matters

• Students should miss no more than 9 days of school each year to stay engaged, successful and on track to graduation.

• Absences can be a sign that a student is losing interest in school, struggling with school work, dealing with a bully or facing some other potentially serious difficulty.

• By 6th grade, absenteeism is one of three signs that a student may drop out of high school.

• Missing 10 percent, or about 18 days, of the school year can drastically affect a student's academic success.

• Students can be chronically absent even if they only miss a day or two every few weeks.

• Attendance is an important life skill that will help your child graduate from college and keep a job.

Chasco Middle School is continually striving to increase our attendance! Our challenge this school year is to maintain and improve our overall percentage, especially since attendance numbers historically drop after the holidays.

# Out of Field Teaching Assignments

Individuals who are teaching out-of-field are certified in at least one area and are qualified to teach but are required to take additional course work or testing to add a coverage/endorsement to their certificate. The state also requires a teacher to take coursework/in-service towards an English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) endorsement when the teacher is the primary language arts provider and/or reading teacher for an ESOL student.
